ITEM 5.1 - CANNABIS REGULATIONS

Recommendation: That the Environmental Planning Commission (EPC) adopt the following:

1. A Resolution Recommending the City Council Approve a Zoning Text Amendment of Article XIV, Division 21 to Limit Storefront Retail Businesses to a Maximum of One in the P-19 (Downtown) Precise Plan Boundaries (see Exhibit 1).
2. A Resolution Recommending the City Council Approve Zoning Text Amendments of Article XIV, Division 21 to Establish a Minimum Distance between Cannabis Businesses and Increase the Buffer between Cannabis Businesses and Sensitive Uses (Chapter 36 of the City Code) (see Exhibit 2).
3. A Resolution Recommending that the City Council Approve Precise Plan Amendments to the P-40 (San Antonio) Precise Plan to Prohibit

Cannabis Businesses within the San Antonio Precise Plan Boundaries (see Exhibit 3).
